

Purdue's College of Agriculture Opens Two New Animal Science Facilities to Start the Spring Semester



Students, faculty and staff of the Purdue University College of Agriculture officially opened the doors to a pair of new facilities with the beginning of the spring semester on January 8, 2018.

The Hobart & Russell Creighton Hall of Animal Sciences (approximately 53,200 sq. ft.) is home to faculty and staff offices for the Animal Sciences department, USDA-Agricultural Research Service's Livestock Behavior Unit and staff of Indiana animal commodity/regulatory agencies including the Indiana State Poultry Association (ISPA).

Creighton Hall also contains the administrative suite and the student services suite, state-of-the-art research and teaching classrooms and laboratories, conference rooms, and open collaborative spaces.

The Land O'Lakes Center for Experiential Learning (approximately 13,050 square feet) is home to the Boilermaker Butcher Block and the meat and protein science teaching and research classrooms and laboratories. The Purina Pavilion (approximately 6,750 sq. ft.) is a multi-purpose space equipped for live animals and large audiences with built-in bleachers and technology including sound, audio and video.

The ISPA and its members, as well as other commodity groups and businesses provided funding for the Animal Science Buildings.

Autumn's Dawn



Egg Facts and Trivia

- Indiana ranks 2nd in the United States with more than 31,770,000 egg layers (chickens that lay eggs).
- The United States has approx. 320 million laying hens.
- The average American eats 275 eggs per year.
- Luckily, egg farmers produce approx. 75 billion eggs each year!
- An average hen lays approx. 250-300 eggs every year.
- As a hen grows older, she produces larger eggs.
- White eggs are produced by hens with white feathers and ear lobes. Brown eggs come from hens with red feathers and red ear lobes.
- There is no nutritional difference between brown and white eggs.
- Legend has it that the folds in a chef's hat represents the number of ways he or she knew how to cook an egg. The vaunted 100fold hat was reserved for the heads of only the most knowledgeable of culinary experts.
- Chickens came to the New World with Columbus on his second trip in 1493.
